### Match background

A home game with FC Zenit St. Petersburg, already certain of finishing third in Group H, gives Real Madrid CF the chance to win the section. To do that they must win their final fixture – and first under new coach Juande Ramos – and hope Juventus lose at home to FC BATE Borisov.

- Madrid appointed former Sevilla FC and Tottenham Hotspur FC coach Ramos after parting company with Bernd Schuster on the eve of the game. The 54-year-old Ramos has agreed to take charge until the end of the season.
- After successive defeats by Juventus, Madrid were glad to return to a winning mode in Minsk on Matchday 5 when Raúl González struck the only goal of the game against BATE. It put them on nine points, two behind Juve. Three of those points came in the first fixture between these sides. It was an enthralling affair, an own goal by Tomáš Hubočan putting Madrid ahead and after Danny had levelled, the three-time UEFA Champions League winners got their noses in front again as Ruud van Nistelrooy took advantage of more defensive uncertainty. The 2-1 victory followed a 2-0 win on Matchday 1 with Sergio Ramos and Van Nistelrooy on the scoresheet in Madrid to defeat BATE.
- The home and away fixtures with Juventus proved hugely disappointing for the Spanish champions. Alessandro Del Piero shot the home side ahead in Turin and Amauri made it 2-0. Van Nistelrooy's 66th-minute header cut the arrears but it ended 2-1. Madrid's hopes of gaining revenge on home soil foundered at the hands of Del Piero once again, the Juve captain scoring a superb goal in each half.
- Zenit drew 0-0 against Juventus last time out to leave them winless from their three home games. They dominated possession for long periods yet it was their resolute Italian visitors, already guaranteed a place in the next phase, who passed up the best opportunities, hitting the woodwork twice in the first half. Nevertheless, Madrid's win the same night guaranteed a third-place finish for Zenit and the chance to retain their UEFA Cup trophy.
- They had gained their debut victory in the UEFA Champions League on Matchday 4 when Pavel Pogrebnyak's first-half strike silenced the Dinamo Stadium and set up Zenit's 2-0 victory away to BATE. Sébastien Puygrenier was sent off midway through the second half but Dick Advocaat's team stayed in charge and Danny scored the second goal four minutes into stoppage time.
- It had proved more difficult for Zenit in the home game with BATE two weeks previously, though, and the Russian side looked to be heading for defeat after substitute Pavel Nekhaychik scored on 52 minutes. The hosts, who had earlier struck the frame of the goal twice and squandered a host of other chances, finally drew level ten minutes from time when Fatih Tekke evaded the offside trap to fire past Sergei Veremko.



- They had begun their debut campaign impressively away to Juventus and only looked under threat from set-pieces. That ultimately led to their defeat, though, Del Piero scoring from a direct free-kick with 14 minutes remaining.
- Los Merengues have generally had things their own way at home to Russian visitors in competitive fixtures. Their last meeting, against FC Lokomotiv Moskva in the 2002/03 second group stage, ended 2-2 but they had won six of the previous seven matches. Their only defeat came in the 1990/91 European Champion Clubs' Cup quarter-final at home to FC Spartak Moskva.
- Zenit overcame Spanish opponents on their way to last season's success in the UEFA Cup, defeating Villarreal CF on away goals in the Round of 32. Although they went down 2-1 away, it had been preceded by a 1-0 victory in the home leg. Their first ever visit to Spain also ended in a 2-1 defeat, against RC Celta de Vigo in the 2000 UEFA Intertoto Cup final matches. The home leg was drawn 2-2 to end the Russian team's hope of a UEFA Cup place. Their only other trip to face Spanish opponents ended in a 4-1 defeat at the hands of eventual competition winners Sevilla FC in the 2005/06 UEFA Cup quarter-final.
- Russia played Spain twice at UEFA EURO 2008™ with the second match a semi-final meeting. On that day, Zenit players Andrei Arshavin, Konstantin Zyryanov and Aleksandr Anyukov turned out for Russia while Madrid's Iker Casillas and Sergio Ramos started for eventual competition winners Spain.
- The draw for the UEFA Champions League first knockout round will take place at 12.00CET on Friday 19 December at UEFA's headquarters in Nyon, Switzerland. Group winners will be paired against runners-up from different sections with the second-placed teams playing the first leg at home. Clubs from the same associations cannot be drawn together.

##### • Sunday 7 December: Real Madrid CF 3-4 Sevilla FC

(Raúl 19, Higuaín 67, Gago 69; Adriano 3, Romaric 22, Kanouté 38, Renato 85)

Renato struck with five minutes remaining to deal ten-man Madrid their first home Liga defeat of the season. Adriano gave Sevilla a dream start and, though Raúl González headed Madrid level, goals from Ndri Romaric and Frédéric Kanouté left the hosts 3-1 down at half-time. Two goals in three minutes midway through the second period from Gonzalo Higuaín and Fernando Gago drew Bernd Schuster's team level, and Arjen Robben and Higuaín then hit the woodwork before Robben's dismissal 13 minutes from time following a second yellow card. Sevilla regained the initiative and, through Renato, the lead – this time Madrid had no response.

• "My players gave their all; we just needed a little luck," said Madrid coach Schuster, after what proved to be his final match in charge. "I don't think we made any tactical errors. Their first two goals came from crosses we should have dealt with but didn't mark properly; that hurt us. At least we showed we are capable of mounting a comeback, though, and we had chances to win."

• Schuster made five changes to the side beaten 3-1 by Getafe CF last weekend as Fabio Cannavaro, Robben and Higuaín all made timely returns from injury. With Pepe, Wesley Sneijder and Miguel Torres all sidelined, Michel Salgado and Rafael van der Vaart were also drafted in while Royston Drenthe and Javier Saviola dropped to the bench.

• Gago's strike was his first competitive goal for Madrid, coming in his 70th appearance.

• Madrid have conceded three goals on six occasions this season in all competitions, yet still managed to win three games, losing the other three.

- Los Merengues had won five of their previous six home games in the Liga this season, drawing the other. Indeed, Madrid had not lost a Liga match at the Santiago Bernabéu since 23 March when Valencia CF triumphed 3-2, winning ten out of their subsequent 12 home league games.
- Madrid have lost three times away from home in this season's Liga, however, the third coming on 29 November when they were beaten 3-1 by neighbours Getafe, goals from Juan Alín (3, 47) at the start of each half the visitors' undoing. Saviola (55) halved the deficit, but Alín was not finished, teeing up Ikechukwu Uche (82) to seal the points.
- "Getafe were superior and played spectacularly," admitted Schuster. "The margin of victory could have been greater."
- Guti became the tenth player to make 500 appearances in all competitions for Madrid when he played against Getafe. A one-club man, the midfielder made his Liga debut as a substitute in a 4-1 home win against Sevilla on 2 December 1995. Manuel Sanchís leads the way on Madrid's all-time list, playing 712 times between 1983 and 2001, while Raúl is second (675).
- Raúl brought up his triple century of goals for Madrid on 11 November with his third against Real Unión Club and, after strikes against BATE and Sevilla, is now just five behind Alfredo Di Stéfano, the Merengues' all-time leading marksman.
- Iker Casillas has kept only two clean sheets in the Liga all season (against Real Racing Club on 21 September and RC Recreativo de Huelva on 22 November). It is no better for understudy Jerzy Dudek, who has played two games this term, shipping six goals over two legs of the Copa del Rey defeat by third-tier Real Unión.
- Casillas is the only member of the Madrid squad to have featured in each of the team's 14 Liga games this season, playing every minute. Raúl and Van der Vaart have made 13 appearances.
- Aged 20, Higuaín became the third-youngest player to score four goals in one game for Madrid in a 4-3 Liga win at home to Málaga CF on 8 November. Jaime Lazcano (1929) and Pablo Olmedo (1948) both achieved the feat aged 19.

- The disappointment of the Getafe defeat was further compounded by the injuries to Sneijder, Torres and Pepe. Sneijder was carried off on a stretcher after 16 minutes and by half-time Torres had also been withdrawn because of a thigh problem. Torres is expected to be out for three weeks, while Pepe, who completed the match but suffered a muscle strain, could be sidelined until the new year.
- On 10 November, Van Nistelrooy travelled to the United States to consult a knee specialist. It was agreed he would undergo surgery to repair damaged cartilage and treat a cyst on his cruciate ligament, which will keep him out for the rest of the season.
- De la Red continues to rest after fainting during the match away to Real Unión when the 23-year-old blacked out due to a drop in blood pressure caused by overexertion.
- On Monday Madrid confirmed that Diarra faces up to nine months on the sidelines having had exploratory surgery on his injured right knee, which revealed several complicated problems. The midfielder damaged the joint while playing for Mali in a FIFA World Cup qualifying win against Chad on 11 October and made his comeback against Real Unión in the Copa del Rey on 30 October but then suffered a relapse.

### Miscellaneous

- Higuaín celebrates his 21st birthday on 10 December, the day of the Zenit game, while Saviola is 27 the following day.

- Cannavaro and Van Nistelrooy have each contributed a recipe to the Eat for Goals! children's cookbook – in which 13 top footballers give recipes for their favourite healthy meals – which was launched by UEFA, the European Commission and the World Heart Federation. Cannavaro chose Pasta a la Siciliana and Van Nistelrooy selected salmon grilled with cloves and served with vegetables.
- Casillas and Sergio Ramos have been included in the 2007/08 FIFPro World Team of the Year.
- Casillas finished fourth in the voting for the Ballon d'Or, announced last week. Madrid had two other players nominated for the award won by Cristiano Ronaldo, Sergio Ramos coming joint-21st and Van Nistelrooy joint-24th. Casillas is also named among 23 candidates for the FIFA World Player award to be decided on 12 January in Zurich.
- Klaas Jan Huntelaar was officially presented as a Madrid player on 4 December after a €27m-switch from AFC Ajax. Huntelaar has signed a four-and-a-half year deal, and said: "This is the biggest club in the world. I'm still trying to take everything in."
- Madrid will receive €962,092 in solidarity contributions for their players' role in UEFA EURO 2008™ after UEFA finalised the calculations on the amount of money to be handed to national associations following this summer's tournament.

### Zenit

- Sébastien Puygrenier is available having served a one-match ban for his red card on Matchday 4. Anatoliy Tymoshchuk will incur a suspension with his next yellow card.

#### Latest domestic information

- With the Russian season over, Zenit flew to Marbella on 5 December for a three-day training camp ahead of Matchday 6.
- "People have said a lot of positive things about Zenit's performances in Europe. They respect our way of playing, respect the team, the club and our players," said Zenit coach Dick Advocaat. "We discussed the Madrid match recently; it's very pleasant to round off our year against such opponents. It shows our achievements over the last two and a half years. We go into the game in fine mood and I think all the players want to prove themselves. To perform at such a stadium, against such opponents – you could not want more."
- The Premier-Liga season concluded on 22 November, Zenit securing a fifth-place finish with a 3-1 win at FC Spartak Moskva. It ensures Advocaat's team a place in the inaugural UEFA Europa League in 2009/10.
- The victory extended Zenit's unbeaten league run to nine matches, a sequence stretching back to a 3-1 home defeat by PFC CSKA Moskva on 21 September. The subsequent draw with Juventus left them eleven games unbeaten in all competitions, though they have won only four of them.
- Vyacheslav Malafeev played every minute of Zenit's Premier-Liga campaign in 2008, while Igor Denisov and Konstantin Zyryanov missed just one game apiece.

#### Miscellaneous

- On 7 November, Advocaat signed a one-year contract extension to coach Zenit until the end of the 2009 season, two weeks after agreeing the deal in principle.

- Zenit recorded their biggest win in the Premier-Liga when they defeated FC Luch-Energia Vladivostok 8-1 on 5 October, despite Tymoshchuk missing an early penalty. It was also the third-largest margin of victory in Russian top-flight history.
- Advocaat's assistant Cornelius Pot has announced he will leave the club at the end of the year as he wants to spend more time with his family. Advocaat will be assisted in 2009 by compatriot Bert van Lingen, the pair having worked together with the Netherlands and at Rangers FC.
- Andrei Arshavin has been shortlisted for the FIFA World Player of the Year award, the winner of which will be announced on 12 January. The 27-year-old finished sixth in the voting for the 2008 Ballon d'Or, the prize going to Cristiano Ronaldo.
- Zenit broke the Russian transfer record on 25 August by paying FC Dinamo Moskva €30m for Danny.
- Former Estonia and Kazakhstan coach Arno Pijpers will become the club's technical manager in 2009. "He will set up the youth department, work with the academy and the second team," said Advocaat.
- Vladislav Radimov will retire after the Madrid match and start work as team director next year.
- Zenit will participate in a friendly tournament in Israel in late January. Advocaat's team have been drawn in a group with Dinamo Moskva, FC Shakhtar Donetsk and FC Dnipro Dnipropetrovsk, the winner of which takes their place in the final. PFC CSKA Moskva, FC Krylya Sovetov Samara, FC Dynamo Kyiv and FC Metalist Kharkiv make up the other section.
- Zenit will receive €694,611 in solidarity contributions for their players' part in UEFA EURO 2008™ after UEFA finalised the calculations on the amount of money to be handed to national associations following this summer's tournament.

Juande Ramos shot to European attention in 2006 when he led Sevilla FC to victory in the UEFA Cup. Sevilla had not reached a final since the 1962 Copa del Rey, but in Eindhoven they were in awesome form, winning 4-0 against Middlesbrough FC. Few were surprised when Ramos surpassed that feat in 2006/07 - FC Barcelona being dispatched 3-0 in the UEFA Super Cup in August before Sevilla retained the UEFA Cup by ultimately triumphing 3-1 on penalties in Glasgow against RCD Espanyol after a 2-2 draw. A historic treble was completed by the Copa del Rey.

Like Rafael Benítez and other leading Spanish coaches of the modern generation, Ramos emphasises discipline but also skilful football. Ramos spent most of his playing career as a midfielder in the lower divisions, and was already in his 40s when he came to national attention as a coach, leading Rayo Vallecano to promotion to the Primera División in his first season in 1998/99 and to a ninth-place finish the following year. In 2000/01 the Madrid club qualified for the UEFA Cup through the Fair Play ranking and in their first season in Europe went all the way to the quarter-finals. He was to comfortably eclipse that achievement after being appointed as Sevilla coach in 2005, but opted not to battle for a third successive UEFA Cup success with the club, stepping down on 26 October 2007 to take over from Martin Jol at Tottenham. His first season saw the club win the League Cup - their first trophy since 1999 - but a miserable start to the 2008/09 Premier League campaign saw him dismissed after exactly one year. However, he was out of work for less than two months, taking charge at Madrid following Bernd Schuster's dismissal on 9 December 2008.

**FC Zenit St. Petersburg: Dick Advocaat**

Dick Advocaat has earned plenty of honours in his long coaching career but FC Zenit St. Petersburg's victory against his former club Rangers FC in the 2007/08 UEFA Cup final in Manchester constituted his first European club trophy. His second was not long in coming as Manchester United FC were then defeated in the UEFA Super Cup three months later. Advocaat enjoyed unequivocal success with Rangers between 1998 and 2002. In his first two years after replacing Walter Smith, the side won two league titles, two Scottish Cups and a League Cup, adding another League Cup in 2002. It took the lure of international football, and a second spell as Netherlands coach, to entice him away from Glasgow.

Advocaat guided the Oranje to UEFA EURO 2004™ thanks to a 6-1 aggregate triumph over Scotland in the play-offs, and then in Portugal to the semi-finals before losing to the hosts. He quit directly, going on to have short stints with VfL Borussia Mönchengladbach and also the United Arab Emirates before leading the Korea Republic at the 2006 FIFA World Cup. Following a group-stage exit in Germany, he took the reins at Zenit that July and in 2007 steered the team to their first Russian championship.

His penchant for travel perhaps began during his modest playing career, which brought two spells with Chicago Sting. Even as his playing days wound down, he began coaching with amateur side DSVP and from there Advocaat was appointed assistant to national-team coach Rinus Michels. His first assignment as head coach came with HFC Haarlem in 1987, then he landed a second division championship with FC Dordrecht, and by 1992 he was national coach. Three years later, Advocaat returned to club management with PSV Eindhoven, helping them to winners' medals in the Eredivisie and Dutch Cup before his move to Rangers.

Jonas Eriksson has made a steady rise since starting out as a referee in 1994, making his top-flight debut in his native Sweden six years later and first appearing in UEFA competition as the fourth official in the UEFA Cup first round second leg between FK Crvena Zvezda and FC Arsenal Kyiv in September 2001. The following summer he worked at the UEFA European Under-17 Championship in Denmark, taking charge of three games including the semi-final between England and Switzerland and was fourth official as the Swiss beat France in the final.

A sales director based in Sigtuna, Eriksson's star continued to rise as he won his FIFA badge in 2002 and featured at the 2003 UEFA-CAF Meridian Cup, going on to make regular appearances across UEFA competitions as a fourth official in the years that followed. He took charge of the UEFA Intertoto Cup third-round game between FC Shinnik Yaroslavl and UD Leiria in July 2004, and made his UEFA Cup debut as a referee at the start of the following season.

Eriksson, who lists music and travelling among his hobbies, was one of the match officials at the 2006 European U19 Championship in Poland where he oversaw three games concluding with Spain's 5-0 semi-final win against Austria. He made three UEFA Cup appearances in 2006/07 and four the following season, also taking charge of two UEFA EURO 2008™ qualifying fixtures. His UEFA Champions League group debut as a referee came in December 2008 in the lofty surrounds of the Santiago Bernabéu for the Matchday 6 game between Real Madrid CF and FC Zenit St. Petersburg.

UEFA information

**Draw details**

UEFA's House of European football in Nyon hosts the draw for the UEFA Champions League first knockout round on Friday 19 December, starting at 12.00CET. The draw will be conducted by UEFA General Secretary David Taylor and the ambassador for next year's final in Rome, Bruno Conti. The draw will be transmitted live on uefa.com and on Eurosport. The winners from one group will play against the runners-up from another, with the runners-up playing the first leg at home. Teams from the same association will not play against each other.

The draw for the UEFA Cup Round of 32 and Round of 16 follows at 13.00CET. Group winners will be paired with third-placed sides from other UEFA Cup sections, while second-placed finishers will be drawn against one of the eight clubs who finished third in the UEFA Champions League groups. The UEFA Cup group winners and runners-up will play the second leg at home. Teams from the same association cannot be drawn against each other in the last 32, but can in the last 16.

**Keynote speech to sports ministers**

The anchoring of sport's specific nature and sports bodies' autonomy in European Union legislation – UEFA's contribution to financial fair play in European football – a halt to the trafficking of young footballers, and a ban on transfers of players under the age of 18. These were the crucial elements of a keynote speech given by UEFA President Michel Platini to the sports ministers of 27 EU nations in Biarritz, France. Mr Platini called on the ministers and European political authorities to take firm and decisive action in all of these areas to help defend, protect and preserve Europe's sporting values. The UEFA President pledged that European football would make a full contribution to building the Europe of the future, and insisted that sport – and a game loved by millions of European citizens – could not merely be viewed as an economic activity or product.

"Sport does not aspire to put itself above the law," Mr Platini told the ministers, "but it is specific. Sport is not an economic activity like any other. Sport is about sharing, surpassing oneself, exchange, respect. Sport is about emotions. Football is a game rather than just a product or a market. It is a spectacle rather than just a business. As good European citizens we ask that you help us to convince the European Commission to adopt guidelines which will allow us to remain within European law without compromising our autonomy – for we have need of more legal certainty to move forward. It is only in this way that we can protect the European sports model, based on a pyramid structure, financial solidarity and the principle of promotion and relegation, synonymous with the opening of competitions to everyone – small and large, rich and less rich."

**EURO solidarity contributions to clubs**

Clubs who contributed to making UEFA EURO 2008™ such a success are set to receive solidarity contributions after UEFA finalised the calculations on the amount of money to be handed to national associations following this summer's tournament. A total of 180 European clubs from 24 of UEFA's 53 member associations will receive a share of the €43.5m set aside for providing players to national sides for the tournament under the terms of the historic Memorandum of Understanding signed between UEFA and the European Club Association (ECA) in January this year, which paved the way for the dissolution of the so-called G-14, thereby restoring harmony to European football, and approved by the UEFA Executive Committee in Zagreb last January. The Memorandum of Understanding followed a letter of intent signed by FIFA, UEFA and representatives of the European clubs at the Home of FIFA, in Zurich on 15 January 2008.

"It is a testament to the new harmony in European football, and the willingness of associations and clubs to cooperate for the good of the game, that we are able to deliver to the clubs a tangible benefit for their contribution to UEFA EURO 2008™," said Mr Platini. "We witnessed a truly fantastic UEFA European Championship this summer, both on and off the pitch, one where respect was shown by players, officials and fans alike, and I am pleased that the clubs can now also be a part of that."

**Executive Committee meeting**

UEFA's Executive Committee gathers for its final meeting of the year in Nyon on Thursday. UEFA's supreme executive body, chaired by Mr Platini, will examine the bid regulations for UEFA EURO 2016™ – the first EURO to feature 24 teams following an Executive Committee decision at its last meeting in Bordeaux in September. A decision will also be taken on the hosts for the 2011 UEFA European Under-21 Championship. The Executive Committee will hear a report on the experiment with five match officials which has been taking place at various UEFA European U19 Championship qualifying mini-tournaments.

### Competition facts

#### • UEFA Champions League: Group stage milestones

Holders Manchester United FC have avoided becoming the first defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/00 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage).

In 1992/93, FC Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and were beaten 4-3 on aggregate in the second round by PFC CSKA Moskva.

S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta became the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League in 2007/08 when he featured against Olympiacos CFP on Matchday 1 at the age of 43 years and 168 days. The record was previously held by Alessandro Costacurta, the AC Milan defender who played against AEK Athens FC in the 2006/07 season at the age of 40 years and 211 days. Ballotta was aged 43 years 252 days when he featured against Real Madrid CF on Matchday 6.

Laurent Blanc is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 36 years and 339 days, having found the net for Manchester United FC in their 3-2 defeat of Olympiacos CFP on 23 October 2002.

Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared in the UEFA Champions League. He was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was then sent off in the 37th minute.

In 2006/07, PFC Levski Sofia joined 1. FC Košice in being the only team to have played in the UEFA Champions League and never picked up a point. The Slovakian side have not returned to the competition since losing all six games in their only campaign to date in 1997/98. Six other teams have gone through a single group stage campaign without picking up a point: FC Dynamo Kyiv (2007/08), SK Rapid Wien (2005/06) and RSC Anderlecht (2004/05) plus FC Spartak Moskva and Bayer 04 Leverkusen (2002/03, first and second group stage respectively) and Fenerbahçe SK (2001/02, first group stage).

Dynamo also conceded 19 goals in their six outings in 2007/08, equalling the record let in during a group stage set by Ferencvárosi TC in the 1995/96 campaign.

Before their 3-1 win against Sporting Clube de Portugal on Matchday 6 of the 2006/07 campaign, FC Spartak Moskva went 22 games without a win in the competition, surpassing the unwanted record set by AEK Athens FC on Matchday 3 of the same campaign.

The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is seven points. The first to do it, since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96, were Legia Warszawa that same season before Bayer 04 Leverkusen managed it in 1999/2000 and Liverpool FC in 2001/02. FC Lokomotiv Moskva and eventual finalists Juventus both progressed with seven points in 2002/03, a feat achieved by Rangers FC and Werder Bremen in 2005/06.
