Match background

Having both failed to get out of their respective UEFA Champions League sections in 2019/20, Zenit and Club Brugge will be keen to make a positive start to their latest attempts to reach the round of 16 when they meet in St Petersburg in the first round of Group F fixtures.

- While Club Brugge were third in their section last season on three points – courtesy of three draws – Zenit recorded two wins and seven points, but nevertheless finished bottom of their group.

Previous meetings

- The sides' only fixtures before this season came in the 1987/88 UEFA Cup first round. Zenit were 2-0 winners in the home first leg but Club Brugge wiped that out with a 5-0 victory back in Belgium, Kenneth Brylle Larsen doing most of the damage with four goals.

Form guide

Zenit

- Zenit claimed their seventh USSR/Russian league title in 2019/20, and their second in a row; their last six triumphs have all come from 2007 onwards. They also added the Russian Cup to complete the club's second domestic double.
- This is the St Petersburg outfit's eighth UEFA Champions League group campaign; they reached the round of 16 in 2011/12, 2013/14 and 2015/16 but have never progressed further.
- In 2019/20, Zenit finished fourth in their section, behind RB Leipzig, Lyon and Benfica despite picking up seven points from their six matches. It was their earliest European exit since 2009/10, when they were eliminated in the UEFA Europa League play-offs.
- The St Petersburg team have won only three of their last 11 European matches (D1 L7).
- Zenit have also recorded only two victories in their last nine UEFA Champions League games (D1 L6).
- Zenit's last fixtures with a Belgian club came in the 2016/17 UEFA Europa League round of 32, the Russian club bowing out to Anderlecht on away goals having lost 2-0 in Belgium before a 3-1 home success in which they conceded in the 90th minute.
- That home win did extend Zenit's perfect record against Belgian visitors in their own stadium – they have won all seven contests, scoring 17 goals and conceding only three.

Club Brugge

- Club Brugge are in the group stage for the third year in a row, the first time they have achieved that feat; it is their eighth UEFA Champions League group appearance overall. They have never progressed to the knockout rounds.
- In 2019/20, the Belgian side finished third behind Paris Saint-Germain and Real Madrid in Group A, picking up three points (D3 L3). It was the second year running they had finished third in their group.
- They went on to lose to Manchester United in the UEFA Europa League round of 32 (1-1 h, 0-5 a).
- Club Brugge have won only one of their last 18 fixtures in the UEFA Champions League proper (D6 L11).
- Philippe Clement's side claimed Club Brugge's 16th Belgian league title in 2019/20, and third in the last five seasons.
- Club Brugge have not played a Russian club in European competition since 2002, when they picked up one point from their two games against Lokomotiv Moskva (0-0 h, 0-2 a) in the UEFA Champions League first group stage.
- That loss at Lokomotiv in November 2002 made it four defeats from four matches in Russia for Club Brugge; they have scored only once in those games, conceding eight goals. The Belgian side's only win in an away fixture against a Russian team came in Berlin, where they beat CSKA Moskva 2-1 in the inaugural UEFA Champions League group stage in 1992/93.

- Mignolet conceded three goals in Belgium's 3-3 friendly draw against Russia in March 2017; Zenit's Magomed Ozdov and Aleksandr Erokhin appeared for the hosts.
- Emmanuel Bonaventure scored against Shakhtar for Zorya Luhansk in the Ukrainian Premier League on 2 April 2017; despite Rakits'kyi's red card, the visitors still won 2-1.

- Zenit are on a run of six domestic games without a loss (W3 D3). They were 3-1 winners at home to Sochi on Saturday.
- The 1-0 defeat at Dinamo Moskva on 26 August is Zenit's sole loss in their last 30 Russian Premier League games (W22 D7).
- Zenit beat Lokomotiv Moskva 2-1 in the Russian Super Cup on 7 August.
- Andrei Mostovoy won his first cap on 7 October as Russia lost 2-1 in a Moscow friendly against Sweden.
- Sardar Azmoun's 32nd international goal helped Iran to a 2-1 friendly victory against Uzbekistan on 8 October.
- On Saturday Sebastián Driussi returned from a knee injury that had kept him out since 26 August.
- Malcom has been training separately because of an injury.

- Club Brugge lost two of their first three league games this season but had won five in a row, scoring 17 goals and conceding only three, before drawing 1-1 at Standard Liège on Saturday.
- The Bruges side had won their three previous away games this season, scoring 12 goals and conceding only one, before being held at Standard.
- Club Brugge are the joint leading scorers in the Belgian top flight this season with 22 goals.
- Top scorer Hans Vanaken has five goals in his nine league appearance this season.
- Noa Lang provided an assist in the Netherlands' 7-0 win in Cyprus in UEFA European Under-21 Championship qualifying on 13 October.
- Matej Mitrović has not played since the 5-0 loss at Manchester United in last season's UEFA Europa League round of 32 second leg on 27 February and has a heel problem.
