## Match background

---

Barcelona begin a new era in the UEFA Champions League with a first ever meeting against Ferencváros, who are in the group stage for the first time in 25 years.

- The home side will be particularly aware of the need to begin Group G in positive fashion having bowed out of the 2019/20 competition by losing 8-2 to eventual champions Bayern München in the quarter-finals – their heaviest defeat since 1951 and the first time they had conceded eight goals in a game since 1946. That prompted the return of one of the club's former playing stars, Ronald Koeman, as coach during the summer break.
- Ferencváros, meanwhile, have come through four qualifying rounds to become the first Hungarian side to make it this far in the UEFA Champions League for 11 years.

### Form guide

#### Barcelona

- Second in the Spanish Liga behind Real Madrid last season, this is Barcelona's 25th UEFA Champions League campaign, a competition record they share with Madrid. They have reached the round of 16 or better for the last 16 seasons, winning their group every year from 2007/08 onwards and a record 21 times in all. They are unbeaten in their last three group stage campaigns, and have come through their section undefeated a record 13 times. It is 20 years since Barça last failed to finish in the top two of their UEFA Champions League group.
- In 2019/20, Barcelona picked up 14 points to finish four clear of Borussia Dortmund in their section. They picked up seven points both home and away, beating Internazionale 2-1 twice, winning by the same score at Slavia Praha and also defeating Dortmund 3-1 at the Camp Nou; they were held to goalless draws in Germany and at home by Slavia.
- Having replaced Ernesto Valverde with Quique Setién as coach, the Blaugrana then saw off Napoli in the round of 16 (1-1 a, 3-1 h), only to suffer their heaviest European loss in the quarter-finals in Lisbon as they went down 8-2 to Bayern.
- That defeat was only Barcelona's third loss in their last 32 UEFA Champions League fixtures (W19 D10).
- Barcelona are unbeaten in 36 UEFA Champions League home matches, a run that started in September 2013 (W32 D4); the 5-1 defeat of Lyon in the 2018/19 round of 16 second leg eclipsed the previous competition record of 29 set by Bayern between March 1998 and April 2002.
- Barcelona have appeared in 13 successive UEFA Champions League quarter-finals, a competition record. They last failed to reach the last eight in 2006/07.
- Barcelona have been European champions on five occasions, most recently in 2015. Koeman, who succeeded Setién as coach in August, scored the winner in their first final victory against Sampdoria in 1992.
- This is Barcelona's third game against Hungarian opposition, and a first since 1975. They won both those previous encounters, defeating Vasas 3-1 at home and 1-0 away in the 1975/76 UEFA Cup third round.

#### Ferencváros

- Having claimed their 31st league title – and second in succession – in 2019/20, Ferencváros are making their second appearance in the UEFA Champions League group stage, having featured in 1995/96.
- Twenty-five years ago the Hungarian club finished third in a section behind Ajax and Real Madrid, four of their five points coming against Swiss club Grasshoppers – including their sole victory, a 3-0 away win.
- All of Ferencváros's next five UEFA Champions League campaigns foundered in the qualifying phase, including in 2019/20 when they came through two rounds only to suffer a heavy defeat against Dinamo Zagreb in the third qualifying round (1-1 a, 0-4 h) – the second leg equalling their heaviest home European loss.
- Ferencváros went on to defeat Sūduva of Lithuania in the UEFA Europa League play-offs (0-0 a, 4-2 h) before picking up seven points in the group stage to finish third in their section behind Espanyol and Ludogorets.
- Serhiy Rebrov's team scored two or more goals in each of their first four UEFA Champions League matches this season, beating Swedish side Djurgården 2-0 at home in the first qualifying round before 2-1 successes at Celtic and at home to Dinamo Zagreb. They drew 3-3 at Molde in the first leg of their play-off tie and went through on away goals after a scoreless home draw in the return.
- The most successful of Fradi's 12 previous European Cup campaigns came in 1965/66, when they got as far as the quarter-finals before losing to Internazionale.
- Ferencváros are the first Hungarian club to feature in the UEFA Champions League group stage since Debrecen in 2009/10 – only the country's second appearance after Ferencváros in 1995.
- Ferencváros are taking on Spanish opposition for the second season running, having drawn both games against

Barcelona's city rivals Espanyol in last season's UEFA Europa League group stage (1-1 a, 2-2 h). That made it three successive draws against Liga clubs since their previous trip to Spain, a 6-1 loss at Real Madrid on Matchday 3 of the 1995/96 UEFA Champions League. They drew 1-1 in the Budapest return.

- Four of Ferencváros's six games against Spanish side have ended in draws; they won only the first, 2-1 at home to Athletic Club in the 1982/83 UEFA Cup first round.

#### Links and trivia

- Lionel Messi made his international debut in Hungary, coming on as a second-half substitute in Argentina's 2-1 friendly win in Budapest on 17 August 2005. It proved short-lived as within 90 seconds of his introduction, he was sent off for violent conduct

- Sergi Roberto's next appearance in UEFA club competition will be his 50th.
- Barcelona were beaten 1-0 at Getafe on Saturday, their first Liga defeat under new coach Ronald Koeman (W2 D1).
- Sergiño Dest became the first American to play for Barcelona when he made his debut as a substitute in a 1-1 home draw against Sevilla on 4 October.
- Ansu Fati has scored three goals in four Liga appearances this season.
- Lionel Messi scored a penalty winner for Argentina in their 1-0 2022 FIFA World Cup qualifying victory against Ecuador on 8 October.
- Antoine Griezmann scored in France's 7-1 friendly victory over Ukraine on 7 October and in the 2-1 UEFA Nations league victory over Croatia seven days later.
- Philippe Coutinho was on target in in Brazil's 5-0 win against Bolivia in World Cup qualifying on 9 October.
- Pjanić came off injured in the first half of Bosnia and Herzegovina's 3-0 UEFA Nations League defeat in Poland on 14 October; he was an unused substitute at Getafe on Saturday.
- Marc-André ter Stegen has not played since the 8-2 UEFA Champions League quarter-final defeat to Bayern on 14 August due to a knee injury.
- Jordi Alba picked up a hamstring injury in Barça's 1-1 draw with Sevilla on 4 October and has not played since.
- Samuel Umtiti has been out since June because of a knee problem.

- The Green Eagles' first match of the season was a 1-1 draw at city rivals MTK Budapest on 14 August.
- Ferencváros are unbeaten in the league this season (W4 D1), winning 2-0 at Kisvárdá on Friday.
- Furthermore, Ferencváros's record in all competitions in 2020/21 is W8 D3.
- Isael has three goals in his last two league games, as many as he managed in his previous 19 outings.
- Serhiy Rebrov's team have also progressed to the last 32 of the Hungarian Cup with a 6-1 victory at lower-league Ráckeve on 19 September.
- Dávid Sigér and substitute Endre Botka helped Hungary to a 3-1 win in Bulgaria in the UEFA EURO 2020 play-off semi-final on 8 October.
- Only two members of the Ferencváros squad have ever played in the UEFA Champions League: Róbert Mak (two

appearances for Zenit in 2019/20) and Oleksandr Zubkov (one for Shakhtar Donetsk in 2017/18). All three of those appearances came as a substitute.
