Match background

There is nothing between Manchester United and Atlético de Madrid as they meet at Old Trafford chasing a place in the UEFA Champions League quarter-finals.

- The Spanish side struck first at their Estadio Metropolitano home on 23 February, João Félix heading them into a seventh-minute lead that looked as if it would be enough to get them an advantage to take to Manchester, only for United substitute Anthony Elanga to level in the 80th minute, five minutes after coming on.
- Elanga's goal was the 400th scored by United in the UEFA Champions League, group stage to final, and also the 100th conceded by Atlético.
- While Atleti have reached the knockout rounds for the eighth time in the last nine seasons, their English opponents are in the last 16 for the first time since 2018/19 – although this is their 12th appearance at this stage overall, three more than the Spanish club.
- This season United finished first in Group F after bouncing back from a shock opening defeat while Atlético had to wait until Matchday 6 to secure progress from Group B, a 3-1 win at Porto taking them through as runners-up behind Liverpool.

Previous meetings

- Atlético ended United's defence of the European Cup Winners' Cup in the sides' only previous tie, in the 1991/92 second round.
- The Spanish side seized control of the contest with a 3-0 first-leg win in Madrid, Paulo Futre opening the scoring for Luis Aragonés' team in the 32nd minute and making it 2-0 in the 86th, two minutes before Manolo added Atleti's third at their old Vicente Calderón home.
- Mark Hughes gave Alex Ferguson's United hope of a comeback four minutes into the Old Trafford return but the home side were unable to add to that goal and Bernd Schuster settled the contest with a 68th-minute equaliser.
- Atlético went on to lose on away goals to Club Brugge in the quarter-finals.

Form guide

Manchester United

- Beaten 2-1 at Young Boys on Matchday 1, United went on to pick up 11 points from their next five games to finish first in Group F, sealing progress as section winners with a 2-0 win in Spain at Villarreal, under caretaker boss Michael Carrick, on Matchday 5. At home they beat Villarreal 2-1 and Atalanta 3-2, Cristiano Ronaldo scoring late winners in each game, before a 1-1 draw with Young Boys on Matchday 6.
- The Manchester club have now won their UEFA Champions League section 16 times, although this is only the second time since 2013/14.
- This season was United's 24th appearance in the UEFA Champions League group stage, an English record, with Arsenal (19) second on that list and Chelsea (18) third. Overall, only Barcelona and Real Madrid (both 26) and Porto and Bayern (both 25) have featured more often.
- The Red Devils have now qualified for the knockout phase on 19 occasions, also an English record, although they missed out in 2020/21.
- Under former manager Ole Gunnar Solskjær, United finished third in their section in 2020/21 behind Paris Saint-Germain and Leipzig, a 3-2 loss in Germany on Matchday 6 enabling the latter to leapfrog United into second place.
- United therefore moved into the UEFA Europa League, beating Real Sociedad (4-0 a, 0-0 h), AC Milan (1-1 h, 1-0 a), Granada (2-0 a, 2-0 h) and Roma (6-2 h, 2-3 a) en route to a final against Villarreal where they went down 11-10 on penalties after a 1-1 draw in Gdańsk.
- United finished second in the Premier League in 2020/21, 12 points behind local rivals Manchester City.
- European Cup winners in 1968, United lifted the UEFA Champions League trophy in 1999 and 2008, also reaching the final in 2009 and 2011 – the latter four all under Ferguson.
- Solskjær left United on 21 November; eight days later, Ralf Rangnick was appointed as interim manager until the end of the season.
- A 3-1 loss to Paris on Matchday 5 last season is one of three defeats in United's last eight home UEFA Champions League games; they have been beaten in five of the last 12 in the competition at Old Trafford (W6 D1).
- This is the English club's 12th round of 16 tie (W7 L4). In the most recent, in 2018/19, they beat Paris on away goals, retrieving a 2-0 first-leg loss at Old Trafford with a 3-1 away victory in France.

- That first-leg defeat means United have lost three of their last four home games at this stage of the UEFA Champions League, the other defeats against Spanish opponents – 1-2 against both Real Madrid in 2014 and Sevilla in 2018. Their overall last-16 record at Old Trafford is W6 D1 L4.
- United's record in two-legged knockout ties against Spanish clubs is W8 L9, beating Real Sociedad and Granada last season. They had been eliminated from European competition by Liga opposition in each of the previous three seasons – by Sevilla in the 2017/18 UEFA Champions League round of 16 (0-0 a, 1-2 h) and in the 2019/20 UEFA Europa League semi-final (1-2), and by Barcelona in the 2018/19 UEFA Champions League quarter-final (0-1 h, 0-3 a) – and also lost last season's UEFA Europa League final on penalties to another Spanish side, Villarreal.
- The first leg of this tie made it eight games without defeat for United against Spanish sides (W5 D3) with last season's UEFA Europa League final classed as a draw.
- United have still won only 18 of their 65 UEFA matches against Spanish opposition (D25 L22). This season's victory against Villarreal was just their 11th in their 29 home matches against Spanish visitors (D12 L6), and third in the last 14 (D6 L5), albeit their second in a row.
- United have won 12 of the 17 UEFA competition ties in which they recorded a first-leg away draw, including the most recent, against Club Brugge in the 2019/20 UEFA Europa League round of 32 (1-1 a, 5-0 h). That was one of seven instances in which the Manchester club drew 1-1 away in the first game with aggregate wins in six of those ties, the only elimination coming at the hands of Atleti's city rivals Real Madrid in the 2012/13 UEFA Champions League round of 16, when they lost the return 1-2 at Old Trafford.
- United's record in four UEFA penalty shoot-outs is W1 L3:
4-5 v Videoton, 1984/85 UEFA Cup quarter-final

Atlético

- Atleti managed only two wins in this season's group stage (D1 L3), both away from home – 2-1 at AC Milan on Matchday 2 and, crucially, 3-1 at Porto in their final fixture. They also went down 2-0 at Liverpool.
- Champions of Spain for the 11th time in 2020/21, Atlético finished two points ahead of Real Madrid in the final Liga standings to give them their second league championship under Diego Simeone, who also guided them to the title in 2013/14.
- This season was Atlético's ninth successive UEFA Champions League group campaign and 12th overall, level with Valencia; only Barcelona and Real Madrid (both 26 participations) have featured more among Spanish sides.
- All but two of Atleti's 12 group appearances have extended into the knockout stages.
- Last season, Simeone's side finished second in their section behind holders Bayern München, picking up nine points. They were the only side to deny Bayern victory in Group A, the 1-1 draw in Madrid on Matchday 5 ending the German club's record run of UEFA Champions League victories at 15.
- Atlético then lost 1-0 against Chelsea in the first leg of their round of 16 tie, a game that was played in Bucharest, before a 2-0 defeat in London.
- The Madrid club have reached the quarter-finals or better in five of their last eight UEFA Champions League campaigns – all under Simeone.
- This season's win at Porto was one of only seven Atlético victories in their last 21 European matches (D5 L9).
- Atlético have won five of their eight round of 16 ties. They have managed only two wins in their last 11 away matches in the UEFA Champions League knockout rounds (D2 L7), the most recent 3-2 at Liverpool after extra time in the 2019/20 round of 16 second leg.
- Atleti have been victorious in nine of their 12 two-legged knockout contests against English teams, last season's aggregate defeat by Chelsea ending a run of five successive victories; only Derby County (1974/75 UEFA Cup) and Bolton Wanderers (2007/08 UEFA Cup) had previously eliminated them.
- Atlético lost home (2-3) and away (0-2) to Liverpool in this season's group stage, finishing each game with ten men, the first-leg draw against United therefore ending a run of four successive losses against English clubs.
- The victory at Liverpool in 2019/20 was one of just three wins for Atlético in 16 away games against English clubs, with six defeats. The Madrid side were unbeaten in five visits to England (W2 D3), before losing at Chelsea last season.
- Atlético have won five of nine UEFA competition ties after a home first-leg draw, although they lost the last, to Real

Madrid in the 2014/15 UEFA Champions League quarter-finals (0-0 h, 0-1 a). When the home first leg has finished 1-1 Atlético's aggregate record is W2 L1, with 2-1 second-leg wins at both Celtic in the 1985/86 European Cup Winners' Cup first round and, most recently, Galatasaray in the round of 32 of their victorious 2009/10 UEFA Europa League campaign.

Links and trivia

- Born in Madrid, David de Gea came through the ranks at Atlético, whom he joined in 2003 aged 13. He made his first-team debut as a second-half substitute in a 2-0 Matchday 2 defeat at Porto in the 2009/10 UEFA Champions League and went on to play 84 games for the club in all competitions, including eight in Atleti's victorious UEFA Europa League campaign in 2009/10. De Gea also played in a Copa del Rey final defeat by Sevilla the same season and in the 2-0 win against Inter in the UEFA Super Cup in August 2010, joining United the following summer.
- Ronaldo played for Atleti's city rivals Real Madrid – where he is the all-time leading scorer – between 2009 and 2018, scoring 311 Liga goals in 292 appearances and winning four UEFA Champions League titles. He scored in the 2014 defeat of Atlético and converted the winning penalty in the shoot-out two years later, also hitting a first-leg hat-trick in the 2017 semi-final. Ronaldo faced Atlético 31 times in all competitions for Madrid, scoring 22 goals (W14 D9 L8).
- Ronaldo also scored a second-leg hat-trick as Juventus overturned a 2-0 first-leg defeat at Atlético in the 2018/19 UEFA Champions League with a 3-0 win in the Turin return.

- Varane's record against Atlético with Real Madrid was W9 D9 L7. Aside from the wins in 2014 and 2016, the centre-back was also part of the side that eliminated Atleti from the UEFA Champions League in the 2014/15 quarter-finals (0-0 a, 1-0 h) and the 2016/17 semi-finals (3-0 h, 1-2 a) and played 120 minutes in Madrid's 4-2 extra-time defeat by their neighbours in the 2018 UEFA Super Cup.
- Luis Suárez was in the Barcelona side that eliminated United in the 2018/19 UEFA Champions League quarter-finals, playing 90 minutes in both a 1-0 win at Old Trafford and a 3-0 victory at the Camp Nou.
- Atlético's January signing Daniel Wass started both legs of Celta Vigo's defeat against United in the 2016/17 UEFA Europa League quarter-finals.

• UEFA Champions League squad changes

- Cristiano Ronaldo has made 182 appearances in the UEFA Champions League, group stage to final, extending his own competition record. He had gone ahead of Iker Casillas's previous best of 177 in the second round of games.
- On Saturday Ronaldo became, aged 37 years 35 days, the second oldest player behind Teddy Sheringham to score a Premier League hat-trick with all three goals in United's 3-2 win at home to Spurs. It was his first treble in the English top flight since January 2008, the longest gap in Premier League history.
- The hat-trick at the weekend was the 49th of Ronaldo's club career.
- That result made United the first team to win 400 home games in the Premier League era. Twenty-three of those victories have come against Spurs, another record.
- United have still won only three of their last nine games in all competitions (D5 L1).
- The Red Devils scored once in their first two games after the first leg at Atlético, being held 0-0 at home by Watford in the first of them on 26 February.
- On 6 March United were then beaten 4-1 at local rivals Manchester City, one of only two defeats in their last 22 games in all competitions (W11 D9).
- The win against Spurs was only United's second in their last five home games, drawing the other three.
- A 1-0 Premier League loss at home to Wolverhampton Wanderers on 3 January is United's only defeat in their last 12 games at Old Trafford in all competitions (W7 D4).
- The 0-0 draw against Watford ended a ten-game run in which United had scored; however, they have found the net more than once only six times in their last 19 matches.
- That was David de Gea's 129th clean sheet in the Premier League, taking him above former United keeper Peter Schmeichel and into tenth place on the all-time list.
- Ralf Rangnick's side bowed out of the FA Cup in the last 32 on 4 February, losing 8-7 on penalties to Championship side Middlesbrough at Old Trafford after a 1-1 draw.
- Having scored only two goals in his first 23 United appearances in all competitions, Jadon Sancho has three in his last nine matches.
- Ronaldo missed the Manchester derby due to a hip flexor injury while Raphaël Varane and Luke Shaw were absent due to illness. Varane joined Ronaldo in returning on Saturday, although Shaw was again sidelined.
- Edinson Cavani came on as a substitute on Saturday – his first appearance since 8 February having been sidelined with a groin problem.
- Scott McTominay sat out United's weekend win with a calf injury.
- On 7 March Frank O'Farrell, who was United manager for 18 months between 1971 and 1972, passed away at the age of 94.

- José María Giménez made his 50th appearance in UEFA club competition in the first leg, a mark Yannick Carrasco will also reach when he next features.
- Atleti have won all three games since the first leg, stretching their unbeaten run in all competitions to five matches (W4 D1).
- Renan Lodi opened his Liga account for the season with both goals in a 2-0 home win against Celta Vigo on 26 February.

- João Félix then scored twice in a 3-1 win at Real Betis on 6 March, the first coming after just 90 seconds. Thomas Lemar scored the other goal - his first for the club since 28 November.
- João Félix also struck early on Friday, giving Atlético a third-minute lead at home to Cádiz; Rodrigo De Paul got the second-half winner, his first in the Liga for Atleti although he did score at Porto on UEFA Champions League Matchday 6. The home side held on to win 2-1 despite losing substitute Javi Serrano to an 88th-minute red card five minutes after his introduction.
- João Félix has five goals in his last five appearances in all competitions. The Portuguese forward has seven goal involvements in his last eight games for Atlético in all competitions (five goals, two assists), the same as in his previous 37 appearances (four goals, three assists).
- Atlético's seven Liga defeats in 2021/22 is three more than in the whole of last season's title-winning campaign.
- The shut-out against Celta was one of only three in Atlético's last 15 Liga matches; they have conceded two or more goals in eight of those games.
- Atlético have conceded 36 goals in this season's Liga; they let in only 25 in the whole of 2020/21.
- Mario Hermoso has scored twice in his last four Atleti appearances, late winners at home to Valencia on 22 January (3-2) and Getafe on 12 February (4-3). His only previous Liga goal for the Madrid club had come on 22 December 2020.
- However the defender, an unused substitute in the first leg, has not appeared for the club since a 3-0 victory against Osasuna on 19 February due to an adductor problem.
- Club captain Koke returned on Friday for his first appearance since 19 February due to a thigh problem, although he was withdrawn at half-time.
- Geoffrey Kondogbia picked up a thigh injury against Celta and has not played since.
- Ángel Correa has scored seven goals in his last 13 Atlético appearances. He had to be replaced after 26 minutes against Betis with a foot injury but came on as a substitute on Friday.
- Šime Vrsaljko also went off early at Betis with a thigh injury and missed the weekend win, as did Lemar due to a hamstring problem.
- Antoine Griezmann returned as a substitute in the first leg for his first appearance since 6 January due to a thigh problem. The France forward made his first start for Atlético in 2022 on Friday.
- Daniel Wass, a January signing from Valencia, picked up a knee problem on his debut after coming on as a substitute against Barcelona in a 4-2 defeat on 6 February and has not played since.
- Matheus Cunha suffered a knee injury in the 1-0 home Liga loss to Levante on 16 February and has not played since.

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League : Did you know?

Overall records

- Chelsea in 2012/13 are the only defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round to CSKA Moskva.
- In 2016/17 Real Madrid became the first team to successfully defend the UEFA Champions League trophy, with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the previous club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United (2008, 2009) all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- Real Madrid then made it three wins in a row in 2017/18, becoming the fourth club to win three or more successive titles in European Cup history, and the first to do it twice.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern München were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.
- Bayern's victory against Paris Saint-Germain in the 2020 UEFA Champions League final was their 11th successive win in the competition (18 September 2019 to 23 August 2020), setting a new record that they extended to 15 before being held at Atlético de Madrid on Matchday 5 in 2020/21. Bayern themselves (2 April 2013 to 27 November 2013) and Real Madrid (23 April 2014 to 18 February 2015) jointly held the previous best with ten, one more than Barcelona's winning run between 18 September 2002 and 18 February 2003.

UEFA Champions League knockout stage

- Real Madrid have qualified for the UEFA Champions League knockout phase a record 26 times, including 25 in succession. The first leg of their 2020/21 round of 16 tie against Atalanta was their 100th knockout match in the competition; they have now played 105 knockout games, ahead of Bayern München (100) and Barcelona (97).
- Teams have overturned a first-leg deficit to go through 49 times, including six in 2018/19 – a competition record for a single season – and Paris Saint-Germain in the 2019/20 round of 16.
- Before 2018/19, only twice – Ajax's defeat of Panathinaikos in the 1995/96 semi-finals and Internazionale's victory against Bayern in the 2010/11 round of 16 – had a side progressed after a home first-leg loss. However, Ajax again (against Real Madrid) and Manchester United (against Paris Saint-Germain) both achieved the feat in the 2018/19 round of 16 before Tottenham (against Ajax) did likewise in the semi-finals.
- The biggest losing margin a side has overhauled was achieved by Barcelona against Paris in the 2016/17 last 16, when they lost 4-0 away but progressed thanks to a 6-1 home success. That eclipsed the previous record held by Deportivo La Coruña in the 2003/04 quarter-finals, when they went down 4-1 at AC Milan but won 4-0 at home; Roma equalled that margin in the 2017/18 quarter-finals, turning round a 4-1 first-leg loss at Barcelona with a 3-0 home success, while in the 2018/19 semi-finals Liverpool lost 3-0 in the first leg at Barcelona but went through after a 4-0 home victory.
- Thirty-six ties have been decided on away goals, including 13 where the triumphant team lost the first leg. Bayern and Monaco have benefited from the away goals rule five times – more than any other club – whereas Inter have been eliminated by that method a record four times.
- In all, 31 ties have required extra time. Fifteen have been settled by extra time alone: eight round of 16 encounters including Porto-Juventus in 2020/21, five quarter-finals, the 2007/08 semi-final between Chelsea and Liverpool, and the 2013/14 final between Real Madrid and Atlético.
- Sixteen ties have gone to penalties, including seven finals – 1996, 2001, 2003, 2005, 2008, 2012 and 2016. The first two-legged tie decided on spot kicks was PSV Eindhoven's 4-2 victory over Lyon on 13 April 2005 after a 2-2 aggregate draw, still the only quarter-final to go to penalties. Bayern, Chelsea and Atlético have all appeared in three shoot-outs, sharing the competition record, with Bayern, Atlético and Liverpool having won the most (two apiece).
- The 2015/16 round of 16 tie between Atlético and PSV was the first to finish goalless after two legs. Thirteen have finished 1-0 on aggregate, most recently Real Madrid's defeat of Manchester City in the 2015/16 semi-finals.
- Liverpool (versus Porto) and Bayern (versus Beşiktaş) both won 5-0 in the 2017/18 round of 16, equalling the knockout phase record for the biggest first-leg lead – Real Madrid's 6-1 victory at Schalke in 2013/14 and Bayern's 5-0 success at Sporting CP in 2008/09, both also in the round of 16.

- Bayern eventually beat Sporting by a record aggregate margin of 12-1 after a 7-1 stroll in the home second leg; that tie also featured more goals (13) over its two legs than any UEFA Champions League knockout tie until it was equalled by Liverpool's 7-6 aggregate win against Roma in the 2017/18 semi-final.
- Bayern and Manchester City jointly hold the record for the largest margin of victory in a UEFA Champions League knockout match. Bayern beat both Basel (2011/12) and Shakhtar Donetsk (2014/15) 7-0 in the round of 16 second leg, while City beat Schalke by the same scoreline at the same stage of the 2018/19 competition.
- A record five clubs from England participated in the 2017/18 knockout phase. Including 2021/22, England has also provided four clubs on nine other occasions – as has Spain six times and Germany three. England is the only nation to have provided four quarter-finalists in a season, 2018/19 being the third occasion after 2007/08 and 2008/09.
- Clarence Seedorf is the only player to have lifted the European Cup with three clubs (Ajax 1995, Real Madrid 1998, Milan 2003, 2007). Bob Paisley (Liverpool 1977, 1978, 1981) was the first coach to win it three times, a feat Carlo Ancelotti (Milan 2003, 2007, Real Madrid 2014) and Zinedine Zidane (2016, 2017, 2018) have replicated.
- In 2014 Ancelotti also became the fifth coach to win the trophy with two clubs; Ottmar Hitzfeld (Borussia Dortmund 1997, Bayern 2001), Ernst Happel (Feyenoord 1970, Hamburg 1983), José Mourinho (Porto 2004, Internazionale 2010) and Jupp Heynckes (Real Madrid 1998, Bayern 2013) had previously achieved the feat.

Goalscoring records

- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer Leverkusen on 7 March 2012, a feat matched by Shakhtar Donetsk's Luiz Adriano at BATE Borisov on 21 October 2014. Fifteen more players, also including Messi and Robert Lewandowski twice, have scored four times in a game, most recently Sébastien Haller for Ajax at Sporting CP on Matchday 1 in 2021/22. That was the fifth quadruple in succession to be scored away from home after Bayern's Serge Gnabry and Lewandowski (group stage v Tottenham and Crvena zvezda respectively) and Josip Iličić (Atalanta v Valencia, round of 16 second leg) all achieved the feat in 2019/20 and Olivier Giroud did likewise for Chelsea at Sevilla in the 2020/21 group stage.
- Cristiano Ronaldo has scored 67 goals in the UEFA Champions League knockout rounds, more than any other player. Messi is second on 49 goals, ahead of Lewandowski (26), Thomas Müller (24), Karim Benzema (20), Raúl González and Andriy Shevchenko (both 18).
- Cristiano Ronaldo set a new record for a UEFA Champions League group stage with 11 goals in 2015/16, Messi got ten goals in 2016/17, a figure matched by Robert Lewandowski in 2019/20 and Sébastien Haller in 2021/22; Ronaldo (2013/14, 2017/18), Luiz Adriano (2014/15) and Lewandowski (2021/22) scored nine while Zlatan Ibrahimović (2013/14), Ruud van Nistelrooy (2004/05), Filippo Inzaghi, Hernán Crespo (both 2002/03), Lewandowski (2018/19) and Erling Braut Haaland (2019/20) all managed eight.
- Messi's hat-trick against PSV Eindhoven on Matchday 1 of the 2018/19 competition was his eighth in the competition, a mark Ronaldo matched against Atlético de Madrid in that season's round of 16 second leg.

Oldest and youngest players

- Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid on Matchday 6 in 2007/08 aged 43 years 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens in 2006/07.
- Francesco Totti is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 38 years 59 days, in Roma's 1-1 draw at CSKA Moskva on 25 November 2014. Ryan Giggs (37 years 290 days) was the previous record holder.
- Youssoufa Moukoko is the youngest player to have appeared, aged 16 years 18 days for Borussia Dortmund at Zenit on 8 December 2020. He replaced Celestine Babayaro, who was 16 years 87 days when he started for Anderlecht against Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994; Babayaro was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Ansu Fati's winner for Barcelona at Inter on Matchday 6 in 2019/20 made him the youngest goalscorer in UEFA Champions League history, at the age of 17 years 40 days. He eclipsed the previous record of Olympiacos's Peter Ofori-Quaye (17 years 195 days) that had lasted since 1 October 1997.
